Thanks to our partnerships with Clark County Food Bank, Bi-Zi Farms, and other local businesses, we can provide fresh produce, meat, and bread along with a generous box of staples. In 2024, over 2,300 families received more than 75 tons of food.



## Rent assistance



Staying in their homes keeps families safe and strong. In 2024, we helped 104 families with their rent. The need continues to be very high, since the cost of housing keeps rising.



### **Holiday Programs**



During the Holiday Season, we provided 100 families with substantial Thanksgiving boxes and over 30 families with Christmas presents and stockings for over 100 children, plus a food box. Thank You to all those who helped with these projects!!
